

From the Board

As we enter into the Fall/Winter season there is excitement in the air. Through the spring and summer of this year the club has been actively working towards AKC full recognition as a breed specialty club representing a select area located primarily in Pennsylvania.

During the summer of 2016 we filed our bylaws and requested acceptance as a regional club. In the fall, AKC responded and said we were doing a great job, but requested that we edit the bylaws so that they were more aligned with the AKC template. This required reworking the bylaws, having a membership vote and subsequent passing of the new constitution and bylaws that included the change of name for the club. They required us to reduce the size of our "area" because Mid-Atlantic was well beyond the parameters that they will approve for a new localized specialty club. The club is required to maintain boundaries of a 100 mile radius with a minimum of 12 household members. As a result we looked for an area that would help keep the most members as voting members and we settled on the name of Montgomery County Rat Terrier Club.

We are currently preparing the bylaws and any supporting documentation to be sent to AKC in hopes that we will be recognized in the next few months. Once recognized we will have additional requirements which include holding matches and growing our membership. We are so excited about being closer to our club "B" status and holding matches as we move forward toward the ultimate goal of full club recognition.

Thank you to all of you who have worked so hard on these tasks.

We also want to thank all of the donors and participants in this year's Auction Fundraiser! We had a lot of fantastic items donated and we also had a really organized shipping and packing party to get all items in our possession mailed out super-fast. We still want to find out ways to make the fundraiser more profitable to the club as shipping prices have really gone up but we are still so thrilled with a profit of almost \$2,000! If you have any fundraising ideas we would love your input, you might even consider joining the fundraising committee to help make a difference in the future of our club. The auctions in the past two years have proven to be very fun and profitable so plan on another one next year by putting away items to donate today. These funds enable us to pursue supporting and educating about our breed in various out-reach activities.

The club would also like to extend a huge congRATS to the Southern California Rat Terrier Club (SCRTC) for achieving their "A" status with AKC. It takes a lot of work and effort to get to your "A" status and we are thrilled to see your success. We eagerly anticipate SCRTC becoming a fully accredited AKC club in the future. We look forward to working together on mutual breed related goals.


Canine Musical Freestyle is a dog sport in which the handler and dog work together to develop a choreographed routine to music. The object is to showcase the dogs' athleticism and demonstrate the bond between the handler and dog in a creative and artistic manner.

Although the root of the sport is based in obedience skills, this sport provides for much more freedom in position and movement than in traditional obedience. One of the creators of the sport based the fundamental skills on equine dressage.

Every breed enjoys the close bonding and highly positive reinforcement when learning skills. "Rat Terriers possess the high level energy and enthusiasm required to happily work with their handler. The quick movements, highly drive, focus, and sturdy physical make up provide opportunities to develop show stopping tricks. We have seen this evidenced in one of our new, beginner dogs, Fynn and his handler, Karen McNally. He has progressed rapidly with only a handful of formal lessons." Darlene Chroniger, Greenbelt Dog Training Freestyle/Choreography instructor.

Each breed, and each dog within those breeds possess unique styles and personalities. Freestyle accommodates their learning processes, physical make-ups and age related limitations as they continue in the sport.





Titling competitions offer many divisions making it a very welcoming sport. Competition divisions such as singles, pairs, Sassy Seniors and even physically challenged dogs and/or people are entered worldwide in order to earn titles.

A dance background is not necessary to participate in this sport. The top 5 competitors, trainers and judges are men with no dance background. The sport began as heel work to music.

Freestyle began in the late 1990's in Canada and the UK. In 2000, titling competitions began worldwide under the World Canine Freestyle Organization.

The sport is widely used in pet therapy, demonstrations promoting responsible dog ownership and education and has even been used in memorial services.











I have personally had the pleasure of training 5 dogs in freestyle over the past 14 years. Of all of the dogs that I have trained, Fynn, my male, 3 year old Rat Terrier is by far the fastest learner and even creates some amazing choreography of his own during practice. I incorporated all of his creative moves in our routine. His retention and focus are extraordinary for a new dog to the sport. Most new dogs train for a year or so before performing. Fynn only had two formal classes before his first recital. We only had three weeks to create a complete routine. Beginner dogs generally perform a short routine of one minute. Fynn's first performance was 2 ½ minutes long and packed with back to back freestyle moves that would generally be performed by more advanced dance teams. Fynn absolutely loves "dancing" to music, especially Celtic music. He remembers every single move, where it occurs during the music and corrects me if I am out of step or make mistakes. He is a true joy as a dance partner.

I encourage other Rat Terrier owners to consider Freestyle as a fun, team activity.

"I believe that freestyle training increases socialization, obedience fundamentals and focus skills needed for any type of dog sport and develops a close bond between handler and dog. The finished product is always entertaining and the focus is always on fun." Darlene Chroniger, Greenbelt Dog Training Freestyle/Choreography Instructor.

What is your most embarrassing moment? Falling off the bed



Fynn and Tara are owned, loved, handled by Karen McNally.






Let's Learn About the Dog Mouth (bite)

Dog Mouth (Bite) Terminology

The mouth (usually called the dog's bite) is the terminology used to ascertain how the teeth in the upper and lower jaws meet when the mouth is closed. This depends on two factors - the length of the actual jaws relative to one another, and the position of the teeth themselves. Dog Show Judges usually assess the bite by just looking at the front of the mouth which may or may not consist of straight teeth. So it is also important to also look down the sides of the mouth to ascertain the complete bite.

Full Dentition

A dog should have a total of 42 teeth.




- 6 upper incisors
- 2 canines
- · 8 premolars
- · 4 molars

In the lower jaw there are 22 teeth:

- 6 lower incisors. Sometimes the two most centrally placed incisors are called the lower centrals and maybe smaller than the others.
- 2 canines
- 8 premolars
- 6 molars

A Normal Scissors Bite

A normal scissors bite is where the incisor teeth in the upper jaw are in contact with but slightly overlap those in bottom jaw. This also produces a 'scissor' appearance in the way the pre-molars and molars meet down the side of the mouth.

Some people interpret a normal scissor bite to be functionally the same as a level bite. Certainly in both cases the jaws are the same length. However, a level bite is one where the incisor teeth meet exactly, surface to surface. A level bite differs from the normal scissors bite (above) in that the upper incisors do not slightly overlap those in the bottom jaw.

If a dog has a level bite when it is young, the teeth will probably wear down to the gum as the dog ages, effectively having only stumps of teeth left as an old dog. This can cause problems. The reason why a normal scissor bite is preferable to a level bite is shown by the accompanying picture. Here is a 12-year-old Airedale who had a perfect scissor bite when she was young. But the teeth have now worn down to a useful level bite.

But she still has a significant set of teeth remaining, despite her age.

Some Breed Standards like the Airedale Terrier call for a vice-like bite or a mouths closing like a vice. This refers to the mechanism of the jaws and the way they grip rather than whether the teeth are in a level or scissors arrangement. This is the opposite of the soft mouth required by a Gundog which is required to retrieve.

Undershot and Overshot Bite

The terms 'overshot' bite and 'undershot' bite refer to the relative placement of the upper and lower jaws to one another.

Undershot

In an undershot mouth, the lower jaw is perceptibly longer than the upper jaw. Where the upper jaw is also turned upwards so the chin is visible, the jaw has more gripping power as in the case of the Bulldog, Boxer and <u>Dogue de Bordeaux</u>. An undershot mouth is also typical of brachycephalic toy breeds like the Pug, Pekingese and King Charles Spaniel.

Where there is no gap between the teeth and the surface of the teeth in the upper jaw should be in actual contact with the surface of the teeth in the lower jaw as in the <u>Bullmastiff</u>, this is called a **Reverse Scissors Bite**.

Overshot is the opposite of undershot. Here the top jaw is physically longer than the lower jaw. This can affect the mouth's function as an overshot mouth usually indicates a weakness in the lower jaw.

A weak lower jaw can also manifest itself in not just the position of the

incisors to one another, but also by a reduction in the number of teeth contained in the lower jaw.

In the accompanying photo illustrates a weak lower jaw with a reduced number of incisors. There are only 4 incisors in the lower jaw instead of the 6. I have also seen a dog with only 3 incisors in the lower jaw. 5 incisors instead of 6 is also common. This weakness was evident in this particular dog's baby teeth.

Open and Wry Mouths



Wry Mouth

A bite which appears like this when the mouth is effectively closed is called an Open Mouth. This is caused by the premolars meeting surface to surface instead of the top 4th premolar

overlapping the lower as in the photo of the normal scissor bite side view. An open mouth is usually obvious because the tongue protrudes.

A wry mouth is also a bad bite problem where the right hand side of the mouth is longer than the left, or vice versa, causing the jaws to be the mouth cannot close properly. This is the worst possible constructional mouth fault as it can cause the dog not only discomfort, but also eating difficulties.

A baby puppies' teeth first erupt at around 3 weeks of age. By around 6 weeks or so, 28 'milk' or puppy teeth have usually erupted. These should consist of

6 incisors in both the upper and lower jaw

Baby Puppy Dentition and Teething

- · 2 canines in both the upper and lower jaw
- 6 premolars in both the upper and lower jaws

The exchange of the baby teeth for adult teeth is called 'Teething'. This occurs when the puppy is between 4 and 6 months of age.

With the incisors and the canines, the second set of teeth erupt in front of, alongside or behind the milk teeth. However with the premolars, the adult tooth usually erupts underneath the baby tooth, so pushing it out.

With the canines, the new tooth usually appears behind the baby tooth. If the baby tooth is retained after the adult tooth has fully erupted (pictured) but grown to its predicted adult length,

veterinary intervention should be sought.

Teething occurs during a very fast stage of the puppy's overall development. As the puppy's head grows, the skull including the upper jaw sometimes develops quicker than the lower jaw. This can give the impression that the baby puppy is overshot, which as an adult it is not.

Additionally, a baby puppy can have a beautiful scissor bite as a baby, but if the bottom jaw keeps growing after the skull has reached maturity, the adult could finish up being slightly undershot.

Note the pain of teething can also affect the carriage of the baby puppy's ears. Those with <u>pricked ears</u> often are not fully erect until after the teething process is fully complete.

Malocclusion (crooked teeth)

Malocclusion is the term used when the

teeth themselves are crooked and hence not in their correct position. Usually this is purely a tooth alignment fault rather than an overshot or undershot jaw fault which is dependent on the length of the jaws relative to one another.

Pictured is the most common malocclusion where the two central incisor teeth in the lower jaw have grown in front of, rather than behind the teeth in the upper jaw. A malocclusion like the one illustrated can be caused by the two teeth in the lower jaw being physically smaller than the

other incisors. If this is the case, then this type of malocclusion could be an inherited fault.

However, this type of malocclusion is more often caused by the baby teeth in the bottom jaw coming out too soon, often because the puppy is playing tug-of-war games at the crucial time when teething begins. This can pull the newly developed teeth in the lower jaw outwards. Then these already mis-placed teeth in the lower jaw continue to grow in front of the teeth in the upper jaw, instead of behind them. This condition can be exacerbated by the baby teeth in the upper jaw being retained so the new teeth of the upper jaw wedge themselves behind those in the lower jaw as illustrated.

Milk Thistle For Your Dog!

Pets, like humans, are forced to deal with exposure to toxins on a daily basis.

There are toxins in the foods we eat, the water we drink, and the air we breathe.

We can't escape them. And, just like humans, a pet's liver is used to filter these toxins from their blood. Because the liver works so hard at filtering and eliminating all of these toxic substances, it is highly susceptible to serious damage.



"Detoxification is such an important process not only for us humans but also for our pets. We can be feeding our furry loved ones the best foods in the world but pores clogged with toxins will not allow essential nutrients to pass, causing a weakened immune system. A pet's weakened immune system equals a multitude of problems!"

Liver Damage

There are several causes for liver damage. Viruses, bacteria, drugs, the aforementioned toxins, free radicals, and inflammation are all guilty of wreaking havoc on the liver. Signs of liver damage or disease include a loss of appetite, lethargy, jaundice, dark urine, pale gums or a sudden unexplained weight loss.

Pharmaceutical companies create products with healing and preventative properties when, sometimes, all we have to do is look around and we can find cures for ailments and ways to prevent disease in a more natural form, often right under our feet and in our very own backyards. One of the most astounding things that Mother Nature is capable of doing is producing plants with healing properties.

Consider Milk Thistle

Milk thistle is a flower in the Aster family. A native of the Mediterranean regions of Europe, North Africa, and the Middle East, this plant, particularly its seeds and roots, has been used medicinally for over 2000 years.

Milk thistle is one of very few traditionally used herbs that has been widely accepted by conventional science to have significant medicinal value. It has been called "milk thistle" because of a feature of the leaves, which are prominently splashed with white spots.

Three important chemicals have been isolated from the milk thistle:

- silychristine
- silydianin
- silybin.

The mixture of these three substances is called **silymarin**.

Humans usually use milk thistle as a liver tonic.

However, silymarin has recently been advocated for use in pets because the benefits that have been examined in humans have also been approved as beneficial for pets. It can be used in dogs, cats, horses, goats, ferrets, and rodents to aid in liver or kidney damage, hepatitis, jaundice, leptospirosis, and parvovirus recovery.

Liver disease is more common in pets than you might expect. Certain breeds of dogs (such as Labrador Retrievers, Dalmatians and Great Danes) are more susceptible to liver disease due to a genetic difficulty excreting copper.

Liver Repair

Fortunately, research suggests that milk thistle extract not only prevents damage to the liver, but also helps repair it.

First, milk thistle is a powerful antioxidant. Antioxidants protect us from chemicals in our bodies called free radicals. Exposure to environmental toxins can increase free radicals in the body, which can do a lot of damage to our cells. This is called oxidation and can eventually lead to cancer, heart disease, and arthritis. Milk thistle protects the liver against harmful oxidation.

Secondly, while we don't necessarily think of medications as "toxins," many over the counter drugs and prescription medications can hurt the liver if taken in large enough doses or for long periods of time. Researchers have found that milk thistle can actually prevent or reduce medication induced liver damage. If you have been giving your pet medication and are concerned about the aftermath of chemicals residing in the body, milk thistle will help flush those out.

Thirdly, if the liver has been weakened due to a bevy of reasons, it is unable to break down toxins. In order to combat allergens, the body produces histamine. The liver plays a role in this process; it removes the histamine from the body. If the liver is weakened and congested with toxins, the liver struggles and histamine builds up in the body, leading to more allergic reactions.

The Cause Of Allergies

According to Mark. E. Richardson in his article entitled The Truth Cause of Allergies – It's In The Liver:

"The liver has to process toxins and when it can't do it's job it stores them. If it stores them it also produces additional histamines to protect itself. If an allergen is present the brain sends a message; "Send out a few histamines! I think there's an invader!!" and the liver proceeds it releases too many, and you have the allergic response – hives, asthma, sneezing, etc. Cleanse the liver and maybe [...] you'll become allergy/asthma free."

Additional Uses

Milk thistle not only helps treat and prevent liver disease. Below is a list of treatment claims linked to the plant:

Kidney disease

If there has been kidney damage to your pet because of an infection milk thistle has been show to greatly decrease the amount of time it takes your pet to heal.

Pancreatitis

Although rare in cats, pancreatitis is very common in dogs. Milk thistle can be given to your dog and cat to help alleviate the symptoms.

Cancer

Milk thistle has been shown to decrease the effects of cancer in a pet's body. While there haven't been many studies done, there have been enough that it has shown improvement and helps protect against the potential for cancer in your pet.

Diabetes

Pets suffering from diabetes that are given milk thistle at least once per week have been shown to not have to have nearly the amount of insulin that they would have had to take otherwise.

Clearly, milk thistle has an array of positive effects throughout the body.

However, milk thistle should not be used as a preventative, or a "just in case"; rather, it should be used as a means of cleansing the liver after exposure to toxins (i.e. drugs, vaccines, chemicals, etc.) or as a treatment to liver damage. Milk thistle stimulates the growth of new liver cells in order to replace those that are dead or dying, and helps protect against toxins which could cause further damage.

Remember, medicinal herbs shouldn't be used for extended periods of time. Gregory L. Tilford and Mary L. Wulff explain in their book entitled Herbs for Pets: The Natural Way to Enhance your Pet's Life: "Despite much of the publicity that has been generated about this 'wonder herb', milk thistle should not be used as a daily food supplement. Milk thistle is a medicine that is best reserved for situations in which the liver is already under abnormal stress." Most holistic doctors feel that milk thistle should be administered for 3-6 weeks with a 1-3 week break.

Also, pregnant and lactating pets should not be given milk thistle because the research is still inconclusive.

You can find milk thistle in most health food stores or health sections of your local grocery store. It can be found in capsule, tablet and tincture forms.

How Do I Give Milk Thistle To My Dog?

The usual recommended extract of milk thistle contains 70 to 80 percent silymarin. Each extract should be labeled with the silymarin percent. The tincture can be administered at a starting dose of 1/4 tsp. per 20lbs of animal's body weight per day. The daily dosage should be taken in 2-4 equally divided doses. With the powder format, administer 2-5mg per 1lb of the animal's body weight, 2 to 3 times per day. Read labels carefully, discuss dosages and, although there are no known drug interactions, it's always important to consult with your veterinarian.

If you are a rescue dog where did your human family find you? I am not a rescue. I was retired and given to my mommy.


What kind of dog sports or activity do you like to do? I was in doggie beauty pagents— conformation. Now I am retired.





To The Agility Novice



From the Blog of Loretta Mueller



During my travels giving seminars and trialing, I encounter lots of novice teams. Being a novice is NOT easy, I remember it well...the nerves, the mistakes, the "what ifs". BUT...if I could write a letter to myself, it would contain some advice that pertains to agility as well as life:)

So here goes: Self,

Here are 20 things (I am sure I could think of 100 but lets start with 20) that I wish I could have told you (and you were probably told, but you were not in the right place on your journey to actually hear and understand).

1--You have MANY years of competing with your dog, many trials, many Q's, many mistakes...don't treat each run as it is the most important one of your life. Ace won't like it, Zip will bite you and well...it's not worth the torment:)

2--Novice is important...not as your first trial, not as your first Q, but as that starting place for all the training you have done to continue into the dogs later career. No matter how much you want to Q, you need to really focus on handling and testing the skills you have.



- 3--If you fail at a course, instead of obsessing about it. Realize that trials are a test of our skills as a team..take it as a learning opportunity. It's not a personal failure...
- 4--Sometimes dogs make mistakes...it isn't a "training issue" it could just be that the dog isn't quite there for that run. Learning when to let go is a skill you will really need.
- 5--Plans don't always happen...you slip, the dog slips, you get lost, whatever. Course recovery is a great skill. Practice it if something bad happens. Get your head back in the game.

6--IT'S NOT THE END OF THE WORLD, NO ONE WILL DIE if you handle the threadle incorrectly, or don't have perfect timing, or your dog misses a contact, ...promise. It's just a dog trial:)

7--You are the only constant to your dog at a trial. Different footing, different people, different dogs, different equipment. Loretta--please focus on being as normal as you possibly can. See #6



- 8--Surround yourself with people that are more talented than you, people that are going to lift you up, help you succeed and be there to congratulate you when you reach a milestone. In return act the same to others.
- 9--BE HAPPY WITH YOUR DOG--you trained him. If they know their job, once they get over the whole "trial atmosphere" you will have the dog that you trained. Don't get upset,

be patient, enjoy this journey. Remember that time Ace pooped on the teeter and you were mortified...yeah...that wasn't as big of a deal as you thought it was:) Or that time you got nailed in the boob after a great run?? Yeah...that was just a stepping stone for Lynn:)

10--If you go to a seminar, and there is a person working a dog that "you don't have"...realize you WILL someday have that dog:) It's called karma honey:)



11--People do weird stuff when they are stressed. Don't take it personally...it's their thing. Just as when you are wigging out because you forgot to walk your novice JWW course and you were PRETTY FREAKY...tis life. Accept and move on.

12--The less you try for Q's...the more you will get them. GOSH I WISH I KNEW THIS A LOT EARLIER

13--Lead out, take a DEEP BREATH and smile at your dog...they love you, they adore you, be the person that is deserving of that love (I've fallen on my face so much on this one...wish I had a million do overs!!!)



14--If a person is mad at you...and they won't tell you, there's nothing you can do about it. If they choose to tell you, then the lines of communication are open. Same with dogs...keep that line of communication open...if there is something your dog is doing wrong...SHOW them how to do it right...works great for dogs and people:)

15--KNOW WHAT YOUR CRITERIA IS FOR EACH AND EVERY OBSTACLE...know it, own it, DO IT. If you are not clear with criteria (Ace and his contacts Miss Loretta) you create confusion and worry and someone (you or the dog) will get upset. Probably both!

16--There is only room for ONE CRAZY on the course...work hard to let it just be the dog. REMEMBER THIS WHEN YOU GET KLINK:)



17--When you are getting ready to run, it's just you and the dog...not your friends, or your trainer, or your spouse. When you are done with the run, play with your dog, reward and go on a walk...don't ask what happened, don't talk about it, just enjoy that moment with your dog. This has really changed the way I see every run...

18--DON'T GIVE UP ON YOUR DOG---don't stop handling because you NQ'd...keep running. It was probably your fault anyway...just assume it so you can enjoy the run.




19--TAKE chances. You will never know what you can do until you do it. Start with runs you have NQ'd on...try something you wouldn't do at a trial but would do in training...be a bit of a risk taker :) Start small and work up to bigger challenges :)

20--REPEAT AFTER ME...IT'S THE JOURNEY, IT'S THE JOURNEY...ENJOY THE JOURNEY.







Mustrated Aku. Rat Terrier Sreed Standard

Official AKC Standard of the Rat Terrier

(Illustrated)


General Appearance: The Rat Terrier was originally bred for ratting and farm work. A multipurpose companion dog that is capable of hunting rodents and vermin above and below ground, and to course small game. He is a sturdy, compact, small-to-medium sized parti-colored dog giving the appearance of elegance and fitness, denoting speed, power and balance. Honorable scars or a couple of broken or missing canines or incisors teeth are not to be faulted. The following is a description of the ideal Rat Terrier. Variations are penalized to the extent of the deviation.

Size, Proportion, Substance: *Size* - There are two separate size divisions. Miniature - At least 10 inches, not to exceed 13 inches. Standard - over 13 inches, and up to and including 18 inches in height measured at the withers. Any dog six months of age or older measuring less than 10 inches, or any dog over 18 inches are to be disqualified. *Proportion* - The Rat Terrier is just slightly longer than tall. The height, measured vertically from the ground to the highest point of the withers, is slightly less than the length, measured horizontally from the point of the shoulders to the point of the buttocks. Shortness in leg is a serious fault. *Substance* - Moderate bone in proportion to size. A well-balanced, hard-muscled dog with smooth lines under taut skin. This dog should not be rangy nor fine boned and toyish, and never bulky or coarse. They are shown in good, hard physical working condition.





Head: The *head* resembles a smooth, blunt wedge from a front or profile view. When seen from the front, the head widens gradually towards the base of the ears in an unbroken line and is well filled up under the eyes. The expression is intelligent, alert and full of interest. The eyes are not large. They are obliquely set wide apart and are oval in shape. Eye color varies with coat color from darkest brown to hazel. Eye rim pigmentation corresponds with nose color and facial markings. Gray eyes are acceptable in blue or blue-fawn dogs only, being a serious fault in other colorations. Any blue in the eye(s) is a disqualification. Ears - Set on the top outer edge of the skull, V-shaped, with the length in proportion to the head moderately pointed at the tip. When viewed from the side, the base of the ear is on line with the outer corner of the eye. Ears should match in shape and carriage when alert, and can be carried erect, semi-erect and tipped, or button without preference. When alert, a rose ear is a fault. Cropped ears are a disqualification. **Skull** -When viewed from the front the skull is moderate in width, relatively flat on top, and rounded at crown and the sides as it widens smoothly from the corner of the eyes to the base of the ears. The occiput is not prominent. The cheeks are flat and well-muscled, but never bulging. The stop is moderate but distinct. The *muzzle* is strong, just slightly shorter in length than the skull and tapers smoothly along the sides to the nose. The nose color corresponds with the body color and is entirely pigmented. Flesh-colored noses are considered a fault in lemon or light apricot colorations while being a serious fault in other colorations. Seasonal fading is permitted. The lips are clean and tight, and correspond in color with the nose leather or may be pink; either solid or spotted is acceptable. The lower jaw and teeth are strong and well developed with no sign of being snipey or weak. Bite- A scissor bite is preferred. A level bite is acceptable.



Neck, Topline, Body:

Neck - Length of neck is in proportion to the head. Strong, arched along the crest and dry, the neck blends smoothly into the flat shoulder blades.

Topline - Smooth and blending from the back through the loin and set of the tail.

Body - The body is compact, strong and flexible with well sprung ribs. The brisket extends to the elbow. When viewed from the front, the ribs appear to be oval. The Rat Terrier, while muscled and fit, has flat muscles that blend into the body. The chest is moderately wide and well filled with a discernible forechest. The underline ascends gradually with the ribs extending well back to a moderate tuck-up. Back - The back is level and firm from the withers to the loin. The short loin has a slight muscular arch blending into the gently rounded croup.

Tail - The tail set is a continuation of the spine. Tails are customarily docked between the second and third joint, or can be a natural bobtail or left naturally long and tapering to the hock joint. Length is unimportant. The carriage is variable depending on attitude, carried from slightly below horizontal to almost erect, but not over the back or a ring tail.


Forequarters: The shoulder blades are well laid back with flat muscles providing enough space between the shoulder blades to allow for free movement. The shoulder blades and the upper arms are nearly equal in length and well set back so that the elbows fall directly under the highest point of the shoulder blade. The depth of the body at the elbow is the same distance as from the elbow to the ground. The forelegs stand straight and parallel with elbows turning neither in nor out. The pasterns are slightly sloping when viewed from the side. The feet are oval in shape. The toes turn neither in nor out, are compact, moderately arched, with thick pads and strong nails. The front dewclaws may be removed.

Hindquarters: The hindquarters are muscular but smooth and in balance with the forequarters. They should not be bulging or coarse. Stifles are well-bent with short hocks that are parallel and perpendicular to the ground. The hind feet although slightly smaller are similar to the front feet. Rear dewclaws are removed.


Coat: Short, close lying, smooth and shiny coat. Texture varies; a very slight ruff or wave along the back is allowed, but undesirable. Any suggestion of kink or curl is cause for disqualification. Whiskers must not be removed. Absence of coat (total genetic hairlessness) is a disqualification.

Color: Any variation of pied patterning is acceptable. Pied is described as comparatively large patches of one or more colors in combination with white. Except for the "solid white" extreme piebald dog with only mottled/spotted skin. Disqualification - Rat Terriers are never a solid ground color without white markings, or bi-colored without one color being white. Acceptable colors with or without "tan points", include the predominate black, or chocolate, red, apricot, blue, fawn, tan, lemon, or white. Intense, dark shades of color with clearly defined and delineated coloration is preferred. White on the body is preferred to be between 10 percent and 90 percent, but all patterns; spotted, patched or splashed with white in conjunction with (or without) any combination of white on the face, head or ears are equally acceptable without prejudice. "Tan points" are common and vary in shades of cream to rust. Badger markings are acceptable. Speckling, ticking and mottling is common, but heavy ticking is undesirable. Sabling is permitted in the coat or as shading on the head or penciling on the toes. A "black mask/black muzzle", on a dog not having black as coloration is to be seriously faulted. A few white hairs do not constitute an acceptable marking. A minimum white marking consists of a patch or strip of white with underlying white/pink skin on the forechest or body that exceeds one inch. Less than one inch of white at its widest dimension is a disqualification. Brindle or merle color patterns are disqualifications. [see last page for color

chart1 Gait: A ground-covering efficient trot with good reach and drive suggesting agility, speed and power. The legs are parallel at a trot, but as speed increases, the legs converge toward a center line. There should be no elbowing out, weaving or rolling action while in motion.



- A Height of the dog B Length of dog slightly longer than tall (10:9)
- C & D Are equal length
- E Point of toe at point of hip allows you to see moderate turn of stifle and parallel hocks

A scissor bite is preferred. A level bite is acceptable.

Temperament: Keenly observant, devoted, full of energy, yet easily trained and obedient to command. The Rat Terrier is a non-sparring breed and generally friendly with other dogs, but may be reserved with strangers. Submissiveness is not a fault. Overt aggression and excessive shyness should be penalized.

Disqualifications: Any dog over six months of age measuring less than 10 inches, or over 18 inches. Any blue color in the eye(s). Cropped ears. An absence of coat (genetic hairlessness). Any suggestion of kink or curl, or coat type other than described. Solid colorations (other than white). Bi-colors without white, or dogs with a patch or strip of white measuring less than one inch at its widest dimension. Brindle or merle color patterns.




